

Contribution on Registration Data Request Service (RDRS) Policy Alignment Analysis (Version of October 30, 2025)

1. Background

The ICANN Board seeks community input on the proposed roadmap for aligning the RDRS-related policy gaps identified in the paper and to help inform discussions between the ICANN Board and the Generic Names Supporting Organization (GNSO as they assess the work of the Privacy and Proxy Services Accreditation Issues (PPSAI) IRT and Registration Data Policy IRT and begin to discuss the consensus policy recommendations for a System for Standardized Access/Disclosure.¹

2. Contribution

Our contribution reflects issues relating to children's rights and childhood. This is based on our experience and expertise with regard to the project, 'Child Protection and Children's Rights in the Digital World'². We will not be reflecting issues of trademarks and other intellectual property rights.

Stiftung Digitale Chancen suggests the following enhancements for the RDRS or a successor system:

- Make participation mandatory for gTLD registrars,
- Make participation mandatory for ccTLD registrars,
- Make participation mandatory for registrar-affiliated privacy/proxy service providers,
- Development of an authentication/accreditation mechanism for LEA requests and
- Setting a response timeline for processing urgent requests.

In November 2023, ICANN made the online-based platform for querying registration data available for authorities and individuals with a given legitimate interest as an instrument to obtain information on non-public gTLD registration data via a standardised procedure. The service operates as an intermediary between those seeking information and the various registries. Thus such requests must only be addressed to one central point. This gives an important advantage to law enforcement authorities (LEA), for example, if they need to identify who operates a domain through which depictions of child sexual abuse (CSAM) are made accessible online. Previously necessary investigations to determine which registry is responsible for the respective domain can thus be completely eliminated in the future.

The extension of the term for another two years should be used to involve further registries as huge coverage is an essential prerequisite for the effective usage and impact of the RDRS. Also, it is necessary to develop an authentication/accreditation mechanism for LEA so that registrars can verify the legitimate interest of a single police department or any other law enforcement authority to request disclosure of non-public registration data. Likewise, it is essential to set a response timeline for the processing urgent requests. This timeline should reflect the urgency of the prevention of critical harm to life. Therefore, responses should be sent within few hours less than days.
